Once you've registered your event we'll send you a kit which includes:

Carlton competition.

Note – the football clinic at Visy Park is restricted to schools located in Melbourne and surrounding suburbs. An alternative prize of equal value can be arranged for the winning school if it is located in regional Victoria.

Why T4321?

Within their DNA, people with Down syndrome have 3 copies of chromosome 21 instead of the usual 2 copies that most of us have. So Down syndrome is also known as trisomy 21 – hence the name of this event – 'Tea for' (T4) 321.
